LIMM Consults with Lutheran Hour Ministries in Vietnam

B obbie Lautenschlager, CEO of Lutherans in Medical Missions, assessed the feasibility of LHM health care volunteer teams to assist in health care delivery in Tra On District in the Mekong Delta. Lautenschlager noted that Vietnam

is rushing into the modern world. Water and electricity seem to be available throughout the delta area, yet poverty still causes the marginalization of some people, especially children, that prevents utilization of the health care system. Lutheran Hour Ministries staff based in Ho Chi Minh City are supporting children with supplemental feeding of milk in six kindergartens in the Tra On District to support their nutritional status. A positive meeting con-

ducted with the local People's Committee suggested future opportunities for friendship projects that would involve volunteer health care professionals.

N. have received special grants from LCMS World Mission sources to travel to Cambodia to assist in CHE training events.
